Proverbs 13:22a “A good man leaves an inheritance to his children’s children.”

My great-grandfather was a circuit riding preacher in the late 1800s. He was born in London, England, in 1846. At least part of his family moved to Canada, and then to the United States sometime around the Civil War. Sometime during those years, he came to accept Jesus as his Savior and felt that the Lord had called him to preach the gospel (good news of salvation from sin).

His Bible was the Sunday School Teachers Edition developed in 1875, and it has notes from the publisher in it. The best parts for me, however, are the notes in his own hand, written in the margins and the back of his Bible. As he travelled across by horse or buggy, he could carry only limited possessions.

I have come to believe the notes in his Bible were sermon outlines that he used. The writing is small and worn beyond reading in some places, and although the leather cover is still there, many of the pages are loose. To me it could not be more precious. It is a legacy of faith passed on from a preceding generation. I have wondered if he prayed that some descendant of his would

be a preacher. The Bible is around 125 years old, and his notes are still valuable and pertinent today. My great-grandfather left me a legacy, an inheritance that for me is a moving testimony of one who served the Lord Jesus. What kind of legacy will we leave for our children or grandchildren? May your legacy be one that will give your descendants hope and strength. See you Sunday.

Medicaid Transportation
To schedule Medicaid Transportation call 541-842-2080 or 1-888-518-8160. TransLink provides non-emergent medical transportation to eligible Oregon Health Plan (OHP) members traveling to covered medical services. Non-emergent Medical Transportation is provided to OHP members like you who have no other way to get to their medical services. Sometimes there may not be any provider that can provide a ride, so rides depend on a transportation provider being available. In order to ensure a ride is available for you, please call to schedule your ride as far in advance of your appointment as possible.

TransLink Quick Start Guide:
1. Have the following information ready for the call takers: Name, date of birth, date and time of your appointment, complete pickup and drop off addresses, phone number and who your appointment is with

and person you will be seeing.
2. Contact TransLink: TransLink business hours are Monday - Friday 7 a.m. - 5 p.m.
3. What would you like to do? Press 1- Schedule a ride; Press 2- Cancel a ride; and Press 3- Report a complaint, compliment or concern.
4. Select your OHP provider.

Important time frames you should remember:
Trips over 70 miles need two business days notice. Please call anyway as TransLink may be able to accommodate your request with less notice.
Next day rides must be called in by 4 p.m. the day before.
Mileage reimbursement request must be received within 45 days of your appointment to qualify for payment.
TransLink accepts ride requests up to 30 days in advance.
