

Tales from the Rural Patrol

Monday, Oct. 15

*IV Haunt is preparing for a Halloween fundraiser event at Jubilee Park Pavilion. After 7 p.m. on Oct.1, ghouls cut chain-link fencing and broke into the building. They stole a 32” Samsung TV, 28” Vizio TV, a dozen night-vision security cameras, two DVRs, a Makita impact driver, and a black light fixture. A report was filed for second-degree burglary and first-degree theft.

*A couple of guys from California took two electric guitars and an amplifier from a gal in the 100 block of N. Junction Avenue at 10:36 a.m.

*Thirty mature marijuana plants were ready for harvest in the 4400 block of Deer Creek Road. Unfortunately, thieves in a vehicle with large tires stole the whole crop, and the surveillance cameras.

*A pipe bomb was found near the fence line at the back of Jubilee Park at 11:37 a.m. Joseph Martin Jones, 31, was detained in Josephine County (JoCo Jail for a felony warrant from Josephine County Sheriff’s Office (JCSO) for failure to

appear for possession of controlled substance (PCS) meth and possession of a destructive device. Oregon State Police (OSP) defused the situation and removed the object.

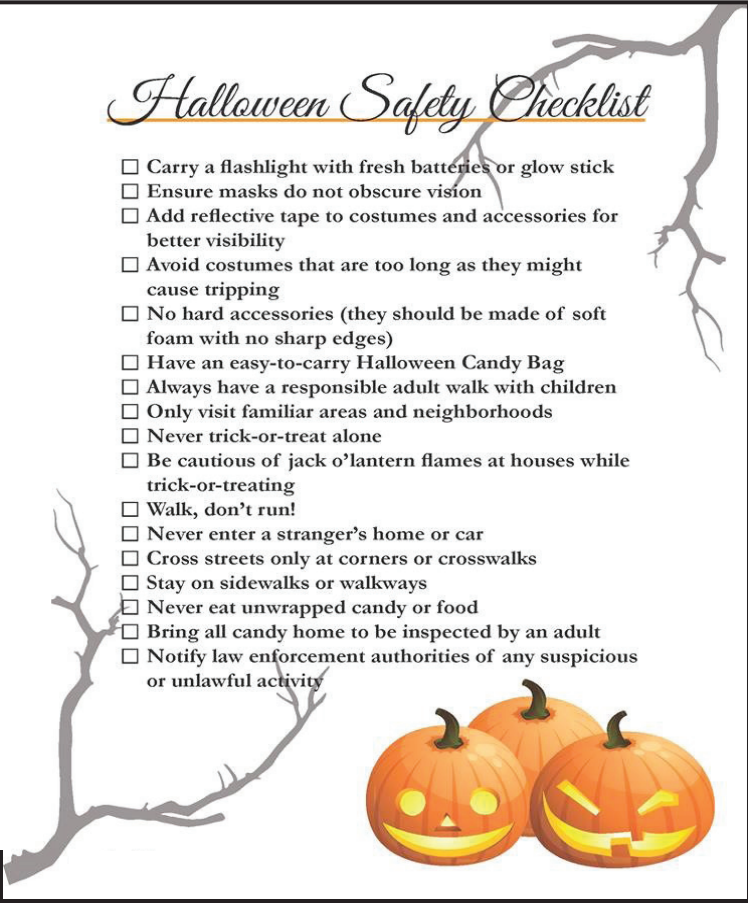

- ☐ Never eat unwrapped candy or food

- ☐ Notify law enforcement authorities of any suspicious or unlawful activity
