Thanksgiving Safety

- ◆ Stay in the kitchen when you are cooking on the stovetop so you can keep an eye on the food.
- ◆ Stay in the home when cooking your turkey and check on it frequently.
- ◆ Keep children away from the stove. The stove will be hot and kids should stay 3 feet away.
- ◆ Make sure kids stay away from hot food and liquids. The steam or splash from vegetables, gravy or coffee could cause serious burns.
- ◆ Keep the floor clear so you don't trip over kids, toys, pocketbooks or bags.
- ◆ Keep knives out of the reach of children.
- ◆ Be sure electric cords from an electric knife, coffee maker, plate warmer or mixer are not dangling off the counter within easy reach of a child.
- ◆ Keep matches and utility lighters out of the reach of children—up high in a locked cabinet.
- ◆ Never leave children alone in a room with a lit candle.
- ◆ Make sure your smoke alarms are working. Test them by pushing the test button.
