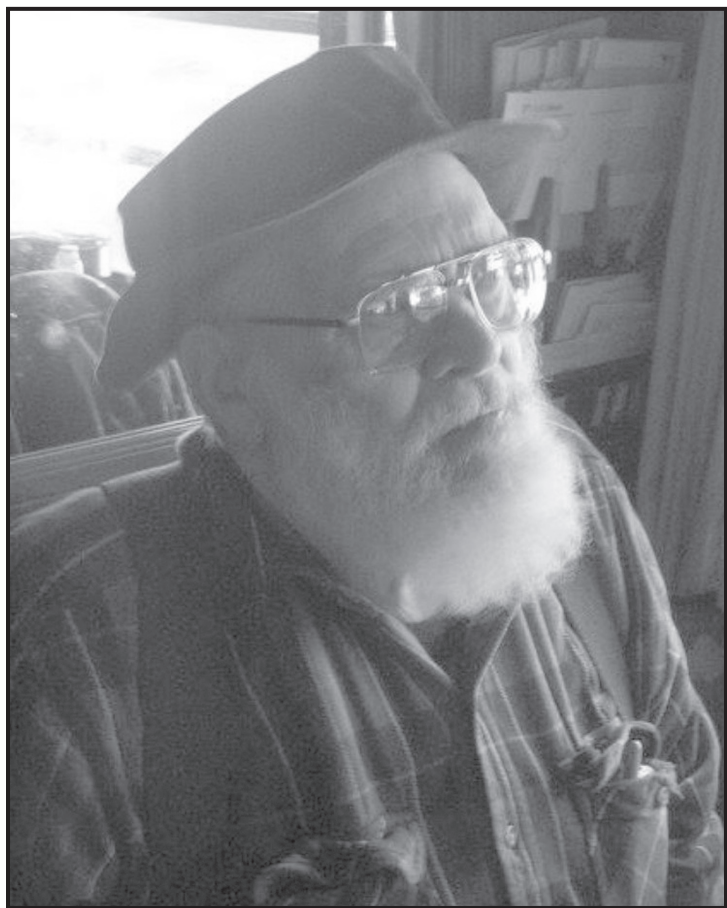


## Obituaries

Lee was born Dec. 30, 1949, in Grants Pass, Oregon, to Paul "Tad" & Virginia (Enloe) Lewis. He graduated from Illinois Valley High School where he participated in basketball and track Class of 1967. On Sept. 27, 1967, in Reno, Nevada, he married his high school sweetheart, Mary Frost. He worked for Rogue River mill before enlisting in the United States Navy living in Japan and San Diego while serving in the Vietnam War from 1969 to 1973. After his honorable discharge, he returned to Southern Oregon and attended Rogue Community College. He loved logging and went to work for his father-in-law, Ray Frost and for 25 years was co-owner and operator of Frost, Buckhaults & Lewis Logging. After Ray's death and Jerry Buckhault's relocation, Lee worked for other logging companies until his retirement in 2005. He moved from Selma to Grants Pass nine years ago.
