

Tales from the Rural Patrol

Sunday, April 28

*A fellow’s vehicle was broken into April 27 in Gasquet, and thieves stole wallets belonging to him and his girlfriend. Identification paperwork, gift cards, cash, insurance cards, and other documents were also missing. The next day he realized his cards had been used at Dollar General and O’Brien Store, so a report was filed for credit card fraud.
