

Tales from the Rural Patrol

Sunday, June 16

*An individual notified Josephine County Sheriff’s Office (JCSO) that burglars ‘paloofed’ a business and residence in the 2500 block of Caves Hwy. at 3 a.m. June 14. Surveillance cameras captured footage of a male driving a white pickup truck, and a car driven by a woman with a hood, face mask, and skeleton finger gloves. Missing items include numerous DeWalt power tools, two chainsaws, a Yamaha dirt bike, two small safes with papers, two laptop computers, and four Amazon Echo shows. The crooks also stole diamond earrings, and fire opal bracelets, which as the victim expressed, were “not the crown jewels, but mine, not some thieves.”

Monday, June 17

*A fellow in the 1600 block of Laurel Road claimed that June 15 his guest took the keys to a 2008 white Chevrolet Silverado pickup truck while he slept. A report was filed for unauthorized use of vehicle (UUV). Jennifer Lowry, 45, was taken into custody and detained in Josephine County Jail (JCJ) for warrants. Grants Pass Department of Public Safety (GPDPS) held a felony warrant for failure to appear for possession of controlled substance (PCS)-meth. JCSO had a felony warrant for Lowry for failure to appear for felony elude.

Tuesday, June 18

*Oregon State Police received a call at 3:55 a.m. that a man armed with a shot gun was destroying things outside a barn in the 100 block of Krauss Lane. Danny Smith, Jr., 50, was taken into custody at 7:06 a.m. and detained in JCJ for restraining order violation, and a .410
