

Tales from the Rural Patrol

Sunday, Oct. 3

*Nathaniel Wagner was arrested for second-degree trespass in the 100 block of S. Hussey Avenue at 10:30 a.m. Wagner was cited and released to appear in Josephine County Circuit Court (JCCC) Oct. 13.
*Timothy Rain Davis had three misdemeanor warrants from Josephine County Sheriff’s Office (JCSO) when he was contacted at 12:31 p.m. in the 4300 block of Rockydale Road. Davis was cited to appear in JCCC Oct. 28 for reckless burning, offensive

littering, second-degree criminal trespass, and second-degree theft.
*Rell Allen Beatty was detained in Josephine County Jail (JCJ) for three outstanding warrants following his arrest near Lakeshore Drive and McMullen Creek Road at 1:49 p.m. Beatty faces charges of probation violation for dangerous drugs, second-degree trespass and theft of services.
*Scoundrels removed several items, including a generator, from an outbuilding in the 600 block of Glendon Road. They dragged in a love seat and appeared to be living there at 6:16 p.m.

Monday, Oct. 4

*Although his nose was bloody, a fellow did not want to pursue assault charges after a disturbance in the 24300

block of Redwood Hwy. at 7:32 a.m. He raised a ruckus after his truck was stolen, but he caused a scene at the wrong house and paid the price.
*A guy borrowed a gold 1992 Ford Taurus from an individual in the 20400 block of Sawyer Road on Oct. 1, but he never returned the vehicle. 10 Tips

Get Ahead of the Winter Freeze

It's not too early to begin preparing for the heating season. Check these 10 tips off your list and get ahead of the winter freeze.

- ☐ Our **furnace** has been inspected and serviced by a qualified professional during the last Months. (A furnace should be serviced at least one a year.)
- ☐ Our **chimneys and vents** have been cleaned and inspected by a qualified professional. I checked for creosote build-up. (Not cleaning your chimney is the leading cause of chim fires from built up creosote. This service needs to be done at least once a year.)
- ☐ Our wood for our fireplace or wood stove is **dry, seasoned wood**.
- ☐ Our **fireplace screen** is **metal or heat-tempered glass**, in good condition and secure in position in front of the fireplace.
- ☐ We have a **covered metal container** ready to use to dispose cooled ashes. (The ash conta should be kept at least 10 feet from the home and any nearby buildings.)
- ☐ Our children know to stay at least **3 feet away** from the fireplace, wood/pellet stove, oil or other space heaters.
- ☐ Our portable space heaters have an **automatic shut-off**.
- ☐ Our portable space heaters will be **plugged directly into an outlet** (not an extension cord placed at least three feet from anything that can burn; like bedding, paper, walls, and even people. (Place notes throughout your home to remind you to turn off portable heaters when you leave a room or go to bed.)
- ☐ We have **tested our smoke alarms** and made sure they are working. (You need smoke alarms on every level of the home, inside each sleeping room and outside each separate sleeping area. For the best protection, the smoke alarms should be interconnected so when one sounds, they all sound.)
- ☐ We have **tested our carbon monoxide alarms** and made sure they are working. (Carbon monoxide alarms should be located outside each sleeping area and on every level of the home.)
