

Tales from the Rural Patrol

(Editor's note: Factual information for 'Tales' is provided by the Josephine County Sheriff's Office. All persons listed are innocent until proven guilty in a court of law. Charges can be amended or dismissed.)

Friday, July 1

*A guy rented a John Deere tractor, backhoe, tiller, box-scraper and brush hog June 8, with a return date of June 28. The renter's address was Jacksonville, but his job site was within five miles of Cave Junction. The renter texted the tractor's owner that the trailer had been impounded in Ashland. Josephine County Sheriff's Office (JCSO) advised that this was a civil matter and provided him with options.
