Temporary Employment Opportunities with Forest Service in Oregon and Washington

The Pacific Northwest Region of the USDA Forest Service announced it will be advertising over 600 temporary positions throughout the Region's National Forests in Oregon and Washington starting in January of 2015.

The positions will be in specialties such as fire, trails, timber, recreation, fisheries and archeology. "If you are interested in working with a dedicated team of people who take pride in managing public lands, we invite you to consider joining the Forest Service," said Regional Forester Jim Peña.

Applicants interested in these jobs will be able to apply through www.usajobs.gov. Vacancy announcements for positions will be posted on the website in three different time periods. The first opportunity for candidates to apply will be for all temporary fire related positions and some jobs in trails, recreation, engineering, wildlife, timber, fisheries, and botany. Applications will be accepted for these positions Jan. 6-12, 2015.

The second round of applications will be accepted for all non-fire related positions not addressed in the January job announcement. Applications will be accepted for this round of hiring Feb. 4-10, 2015.

Gwilliam, Neuberger Voted to Mayor Post

Baker City Council inducted the new councilmen, Richard Lucetti, June Poe and Hans Neuberger Monday night with Recorder Roland Campbell administering the oath to them as well as relected members Larry Pearson and Bill Gwilliam.

By a four to three vote the council named Mr. Gwilliam to another two-year term as mayor and named Mr. Neuberger to be acting mayor in the absence of Gwilliam.

Mt. Carmel District Name was Applied by Emigrant from the East

To the Record-Courier:

Mt. Carmel School was named by Mr. May, who was Ethalene and Euseba May's father, who lived near a town in Illinois or Pennsylvania (both states have such a town and post office) and had been named after Mt. Carmel, a mountain in Palestine. Mr. May was a devoted Christian and a strong supporter of the church services that were held in the school building.

I recall gossip and criticism of the name, Mt. Carmel, when I was very young. One question was: "How can they call it Mt. Carmel when there's no mountain there?"

I attended the school held in the first building in the late spring and fall.

My mother, Laura Powers, and her sister also attended school there. My father, J.L. Dodson, donated the ground for the school building. One of my fondest memories of the old school was the remarkable teaching of Mrs. Dryborough. Also, the association with Deirdre Carnes and some other pupils. Mrs. M.C. Huff (formerly "Addie" Dodson)
