"Open enrollment is your only opportunity to get health insurance coverage this year," said Oregon Insurance Commissioner Laura Cali. "If you miss the Feb. 15 deadline, you will miss out on the protections health coverage provides. You may also face a tax

Anyone who wants expert guidance walking through the application, or sorting through their plan choices, can work with an insurance agent or a community partner, or come to an Enrollment Open House. The service is free, and can help people get their enrollment done by the Feb. 15 deadline.
