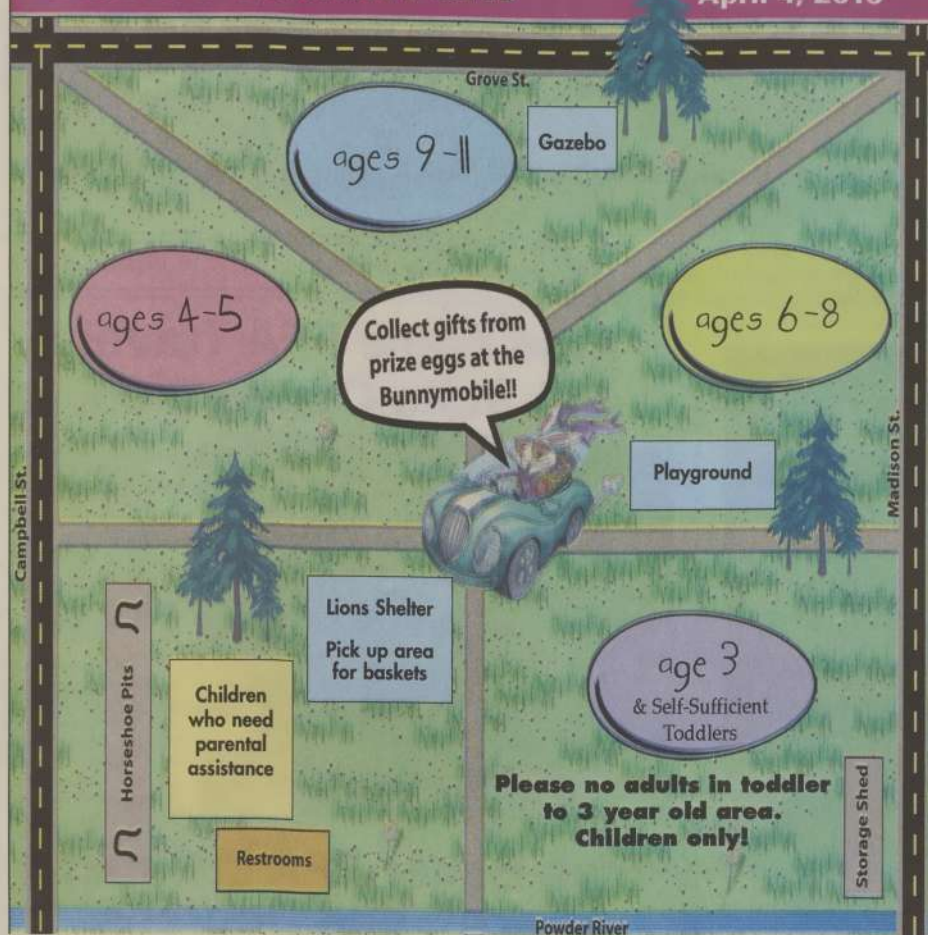
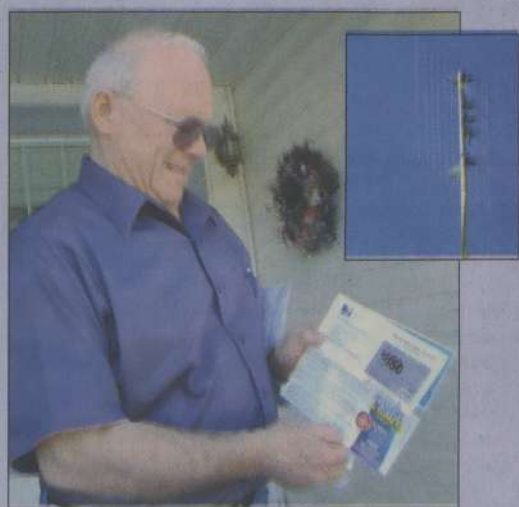

Annual Easter Egg Hunt

The Annual Easter Egg Hunt for community children age 3 through age 11 will be held April 4. Line up is at 9:45 a.m. Saturday at Geiser-Pollman Park by age group. The police siren will sound promptly at 10 a.m. to indicate beginning of the hunt. Filled plastic eggs, toys and candy will be in roped off areas divided by age category (see map) for the safety of the children. Adults are not allowed in the confines of any of the hunt areas. Be sure to dress children warmly, bring cameras and a basket or sack to gather treasures. Pictures may be taken of your children with the new big bunny. After the hunt is over, check inside eggs for prize winning slips of paper for grand prize stuffed toys, go to the Bunnymobile to collect the prize. Volunteer labor for the event is donated by the Baker City Herald, Baker High School Leadership and Honor Society groups, Baker Parole and Probation Department, Baker Juvenile Dept., Baker City Police, local volunteers and Soroptimist International of Baker County. Donation checks to the event may be made to: Baker City Events/Easter Egg Hunt and delivered to the Baker City Herald at 1915 First Street or mailed to Easter Egg Hunt, P.O. Box 807, Baker City, OR 97814. Approximate annual cost breakdown is: \$1500 for stuffed eggs, \$500 for wrapped candy, \$2000 for assorted toys, baskets and cash prizes in eggs. Bob Savage is a big fan of the Blue Mountain Translator District and the service they provide. Formed in the late 70s, the district was created to bring 'over the air' television to Union and Baker counties. Volunteer directors govern the district and include Dennis Spence, Ken Patterson, Tim Wallender and Tim Kerns. At only \$100 per year (\$8.34 per month), the translator district provides multiple channels from Portland, Boise and Tri-Cities depending on whether or not the signal is received from Mt. Fanny, Mt. Harris or Beaver Mountain.

"It's pretty economical," said Savage. A person only needs an antenna (and not a real big one at that) which can be purchased locally at Radio Shack, a pole, and an amplifier, Savage explained. These can also be purchased through the Blue Mountain Translator District.

He went on to say, "so for about \$100 or so to get started, plus the annual cost of \$100 for the service, it's much less than other options. They are the only ones who provide Boise news, which is of much more interest to most people here."

So what's the problem? Many people are choosing to subscribe to Dish and Direct TV and others who are receiving the service from Blue Mountain simply aren't paying.

"I don't need 129 stations," said Savage. "I like the price and it has the channels I need," he said.

ORS 354.690 states, "When a district broadcasts television signals through a translator on a regular basis, if any person residing on or occupying property located in an area entirely surrounded by the district intentionally receives and uses those signals, the owner of that property is liable to the district for a service charge. The owner of the property shall be deemed to have contracted with the district for the use of the translator signals."

Blue Mountain Translator District surrounds the cities of Baker City, Cove, Elgin, Haines, Imbler, La Grande, North Powder and Union.
