



# Baker Sends 11 to State Meet

The Baker boys' track team took second place at the GOL Track Meet on May 15 and 16 at Mac-Hi. The girls came in 3rd. Porter Cline was the double winner, taking first in the pole vault at 11'6" and first in the 100 meters with a time of 11:42. Kalani Heiser won the shot put with a toss of 44'03". Zorum Bruce's throw of 163' was enough for first place. Cody DeCarli placed first in the high jump, clearing the bar at 5'8". Second place winners also qualify for state. Amy Wong qualified in the 100 meters and the 4x400 relay. Others on the relay are Michelle Lehman, Summer Phillips and Rory Scilacci. Scilacci ran a valiant anchor leg to hold off Ontario, and grab second place by 2 1/2 seconds. Jezka Wells will go to state in the high jump. Sam Hamilton placed 2nd in the high jump and Teancum Taylor qualified for state in the triple jump.
