Anna Sullivan of Hereford Appointed to Oregon FSA State Committee

U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) Oregon Farm Service Agency (FSA) Executive Director Phil Ward announced that Anna Sullivan, a rancher from Hereford has been appointed by Agriculture Secretary Tom Vilsack to serve on the Oregon FSA State Committee.

For 35 years, Sullivan and her husband Pat have operated a cow/calf and hay and grain operation. She served more than 10 years (two separate terms) on the Baker County FSA Committee and has been actively involved in the Burnt River School Board, the Baker County Planning Commission and the Northwest Farm Credit Services Local Advisory Committee. Sullivan was raised on a farm in Treasure Valley and holds a Bachelor of Science degree in agri-business from Eastern Oregon State College.

"We are extremely pleased to have a producer of Anna's expertise and qualifications join the State Committee," said Ward. "We know she will do a great job representing the ranching community and providing oversight for FSA programs in Oregon."

Sullivan expressed her appreciation for the appointment. "FSA helped my husband and I get into



this business many years ago and I appreciate the opportunity to give back on a state-wide basis," said Sullivan.

Sullivan's first meeting with the Oregon FSA State Committee will be Sept. 23-24 at the FSA state office in Tualatin. She replaces Cory Carmen from Walla Walla County.

FSA State Committees consist of three to five members who provide oversight for federal farm program implementation, county office and County Committee operations and apply national policy determinations as needed to meet local needs and conditions by exercising judgment based on the effect of program rules and regulations on local farmers and ranchers.
