Johnson also reported local spending costs for goods and services totaled more than \$400,000. The resort also employs 100 people with a payroll of approximately \$500,000.

"My goal is to turn it into a year-round resort," reported Johnson. To achieve this, our Board is looking to take over the surrounding campground contracts, expand the mountain bike trails, and promote the new weekend openings of the Star Bottle Bar & Grill through the summer, beginning July 9 through Labor Day weekend.

The Commission meeting closed with several comments concerning the Tri-County Weed Board and opportunities being put in place to ensure more stringent management controls.

In addition, Commissioners addressed on-going negotiations regarding the Sage Grouse. It appears talks are going in a more positive direction as research is helping to illuminate what is driving the birds away from their previously utilized habitat.
