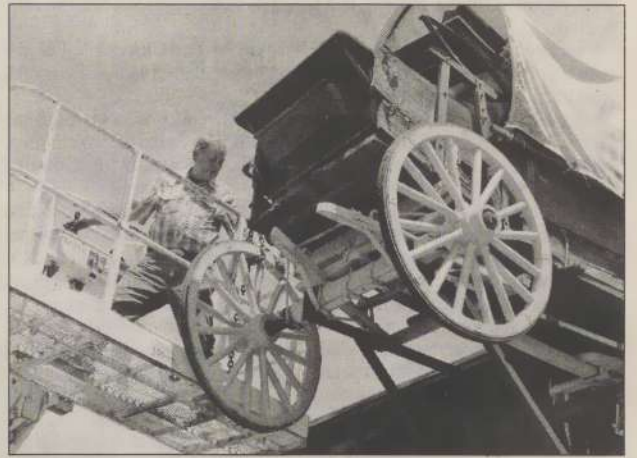
Controlled hunt results are now available on-line

Controlled hunt results are in! If you applied for a controlled hunt, you can now check to see if you got your hunt. Hunters should go to www.odfw.com and click on "My Hunter Info" in top left corner. You will be asked to enter your Hunter/Angler ID# (which is printed on all licenses and tags and stays the same from year to year), plus your last name and date of birth. Hunters without internet access can call 1-866-947-ODFW (6339) to get results.

ODFW received 536,232 controlled hunt applications for fall hunts this year, including 69,192 applications for the new premium hunts. A total of 135,777 regular fall controlled hunt tags were available in the draw plus 158 new Premium Hunt tags for deer, elk and pronghorn. Congratulations to all you winners!
