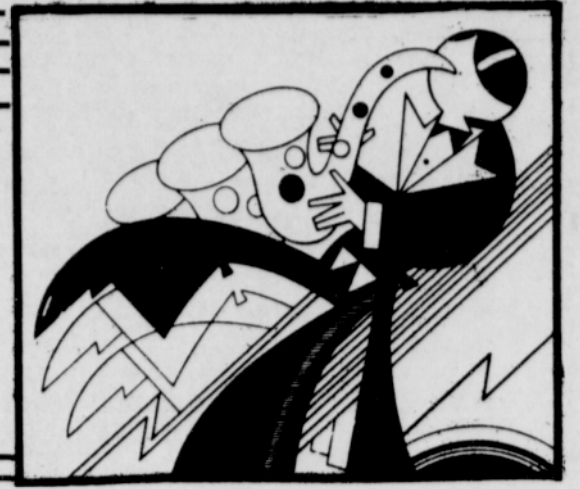

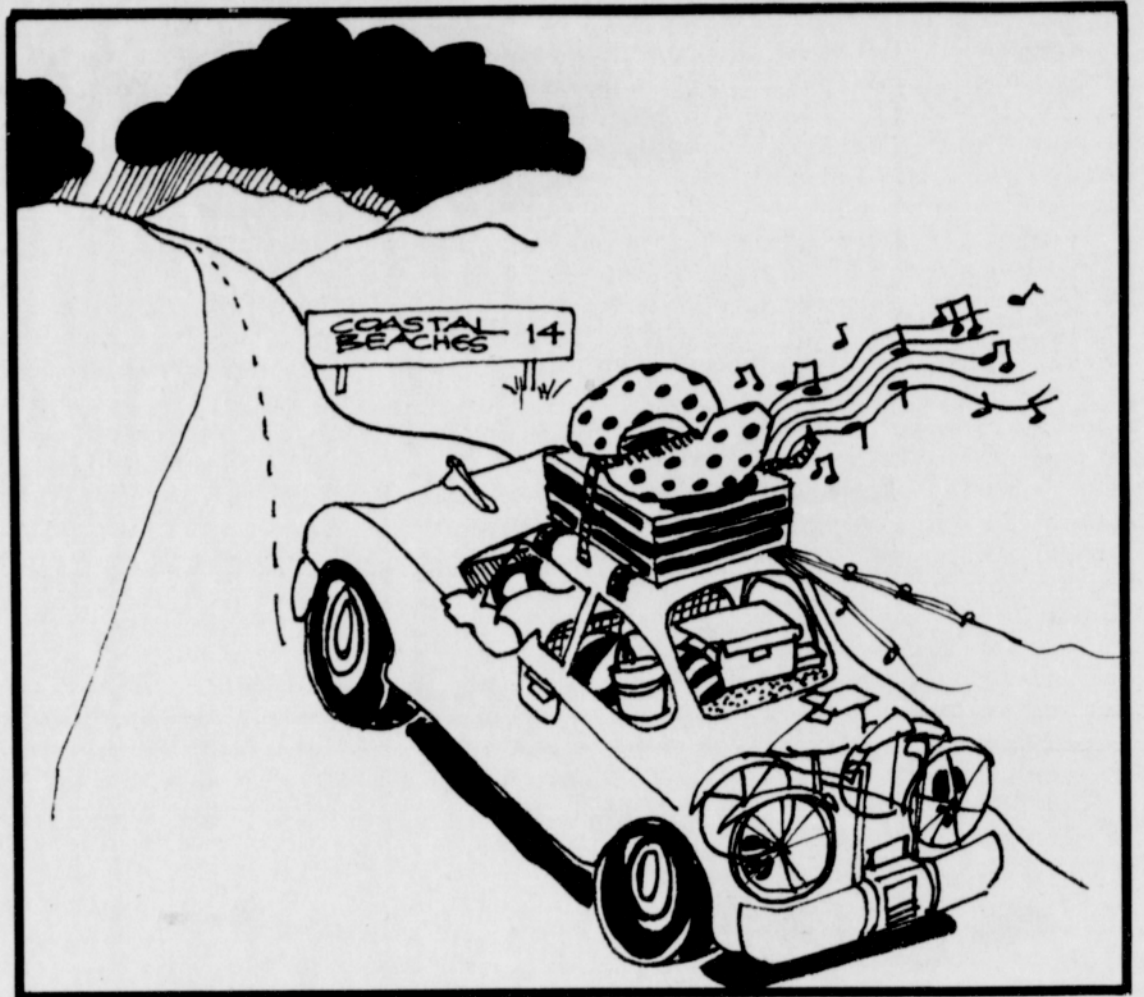

KMUN Begins its 3rd Year

The baby is growing. On April 17 KMUN became two years old. We moved forward a long way this year by increasing membership, putting a production studio on-line, and hiring Katrin Snow as program director. The level of volunteer support has increased and new voices seem to speak up every day. KMUN has started some new projects in the last year. We hope to get FCC permission to install transmitters to enhance our signal strength in Mist, Jewell, Vernonia, Wheeler, manzanita, Cannon Beach and areas just north of the Columbia River in Washington, such as Gray's Harbor. We also are about to go after the quipment for receiving network programming such as "All Things Considered" and "A Prairie Home Companion." We still need to advance our membership totals. We are well over seven hundred now and one thousand is our goal for the first major plateau. We are not going to stop there, of course; three or four thousand would be just about right. In the area of programming we still look to our own community for ideas and on-air people. Some of our programs conceived and presented by local people are magnificent expressions of aural art; poetry, prose, music, humor, it is all there and broadcast by nonprofessionals who sound and think like radio veterans. As KMUN station manager, I would like to thank members, supporters, air shifters, volunteers and listeners for making KMUN a true and accurate voice for this region. Stick with us for our third year and beyond.
