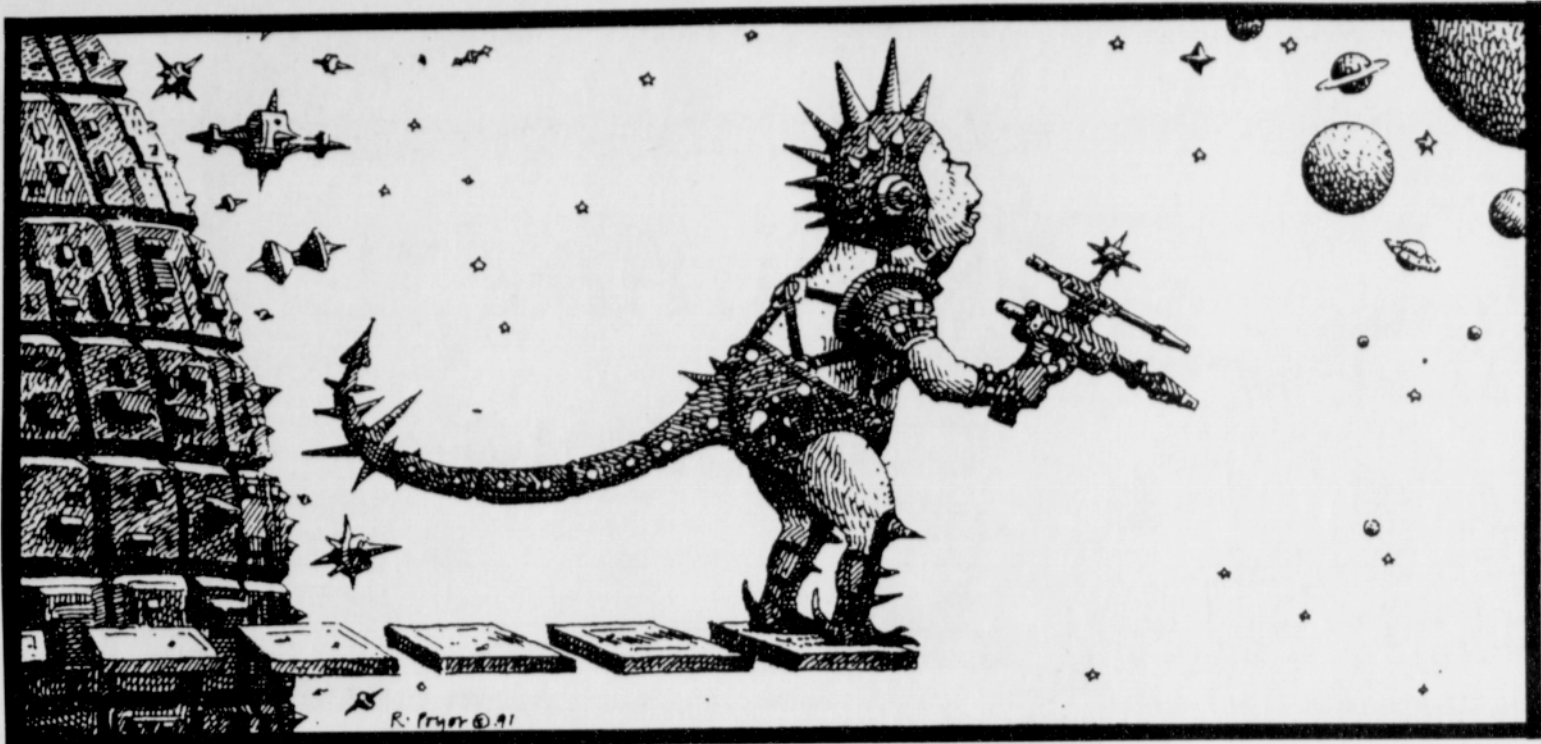

as the fluid cools and contracts, or as Schauberger termed it, imploded. Furthermore, after the water or air has been subjected to this motion, its biological quality was enhanced. Implosion power is in every way the opposite of explosion power.

From every angle, the MISC (military/industrial/security complex) had to suppress this technology. From the Defense Department point of view, too much had been invested in money, time, research, intrigue (and criminality) in bringing this project along correctly. From the industrial perspective it was potentially a total disaster. Free energy from a fairly simple machine could not be kept from the masses and would have ramifications that have not yet been thought of. With free energy, every person would have the capacity to grow their own, make their own, move their own and hold their own. Peer down the roll of the N.Y. stock exchange and find a company (or its executives or stockholders) that would welcome such a technology.

More than gold, today's dollar is measured against the value of energy. And so, from the security state's point of view, implosion technology has got to be the biggest secret of all. With free energy comes free mobility and out goes poverty. It would be, effectively, the end of the game, obsolescence of the external-threat, fear-based basis for the security state. We would become a globally educated and *experientially informed* world community. We would *know* and could no longer be *told*.

About six years ago, a friend and I were motorcycling up toward Sequoia Park. A fire was burning in the foothills and hundreds of square miles had been blockaded, totally sealed off. A Stealth fighter had gone down. It could not have been a bigger deal if the President had been on board. I now know from my researches that the plane had probably flown out of the U.S. Naval Air Test Station at Groom Lake, Nevada.

I will never forget the *Popular Mechanics* with the Stealth fighter cover story. The instant I saw the picture of this truly odd looking craft I said to myself, "that bird has a damned disc in it!" The article showed all views and the shape would easily house a horizontal disc. The most striking difference between it and other planes was its angular form. The word was, said the article, that the angularity was for radar visibility. If that were so, why is the Stealth bomber, which is striving for the same undetectability, sleek and smooth to the opposite degree? Why is the Stealth fighter angular, when every other modern *conventional* aircraft strains to be sleek to allay air resistance? I think this is because with

the Stealth fighter, as with other *gravelevs*, air resistance is nonexistent.

Why, when the government used them in Panama and Iraq and in almost all training, did the Stealth fighter fly only at night?

And did you see, in the movie documentary *The Panama Deception*, the bodies thought to have been *cooked* by *experimental ray weapons* in "Operation Just Cause" — the Stealth fighter's first combat outing?

Why, in the reports out of Bagdad, were the Stealth fighters seen as blue lights when any light would defeat its stealth?

And quite curiously, why, as stated in the *Pop-Mech* article, do the mechanics that work on the Stealth call the propulsion unit "the frisbee engine"?

And now just exactly who, in our *New World Order* with no significant external military threat, are these secrets being kept from?

Maybe our benevolent Big Brother doesn't want us to *monkey* around with his secret stuff, which is of course for our own good.

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Viktor Schauberger, 1885-1958. Few of us in the United States today know the name. Why should we care to learn of such an obscure historical personage?

If in the 1920s the industrially developed world had paid some heed to Viktor Schauberger, Earth Day observances might only be a superfluous and quaint 70-year-old tradition rather than an eleventh hour plea for planetary survival.

The farsighted vision and practical wisdom of Viktor Schauberger should remain obscure no longer. He was a man far ahead of his time in society but was in perfect tune with nature. A nature that was already being forced and contorted with increased efficiency by the new machines serving politics and economics.

Schauberger the inventor built machines to serve nature and patterned them after nature. He invented devices for the purpose of reducing humanity's need to consume resources only to see them used to increase consumption for short term profiteering.

He understood as perhaps no one else the cycle of water that gives life to this planet. He observed and recorded mysterious phenomena in wild mountain streams in his native Austria, gaining wisdom lost to academics. He found that water in an unsullied nature had subtle differences from pure H_2O in the laboratory, and when humans did anything to disturb the motion or thermal state of wild "living water" all biological systems associated with that water system were affected with a loss of vitality.

Viktor Schauberger's warnings of the 1920s continued until his tragic death in 1958. His contributions to a smug technological world were for the most part ignored, his discoveries ridiculed by the experts.

Industries in Europe whose profits were threatened lobbied government agencies to suppress his inventions. In the U.S., the Department of Defense and the CIA learned of the Third Reich's applications of Schauberger's discoveries to advanced weapons systems. With promises of developing his non-polluting energy systems, they enticed the 73-year-old Schauberger to America, put him through a physical and mental ordeal, and swindled him out of the rights to his own discoveries and inventions.

Viktor Schauberger returned to his beloved Austria with the heartbreaking realization that he had been the victim of a great con, and the knowledge of his desire to save nature was used to dash his dreams of a clean technology. He died four days later.

Though there is little left today to show of Schauberger's inventive genius, we do have more than just a trace of his passing. He planted a seed in 1951. A great tree has grown from this seed. A tree that bears fruit today in the form of a movement to save our planet earth. Viktor Schauberger and his son Walter founded in Austria in 1951 an organization promoting environmental protection and the regenerating of natural forests, *The Green Front* (*Die Grune Front*).

The heroic humans of the Green Movement have an unsung hero that many of them have never even heard of. The inspiring life of Viktor Schauberger was chronicled by Swedish author Olof Alexandersson in the biography *Living Water: Viktor Schauberger and the Secrets of Natural Energy*.

Today, as in Schauberger's time, the power of political and economic change resides in governmental and corporate entities who can do what we as individuals cannot. Each of us must do what we can to move them to make environmental policies that are meaningful as well as practical.

We haven't all heard of him but I am certain that Viktor Schauberger's spirit watches over all Earth Days.
