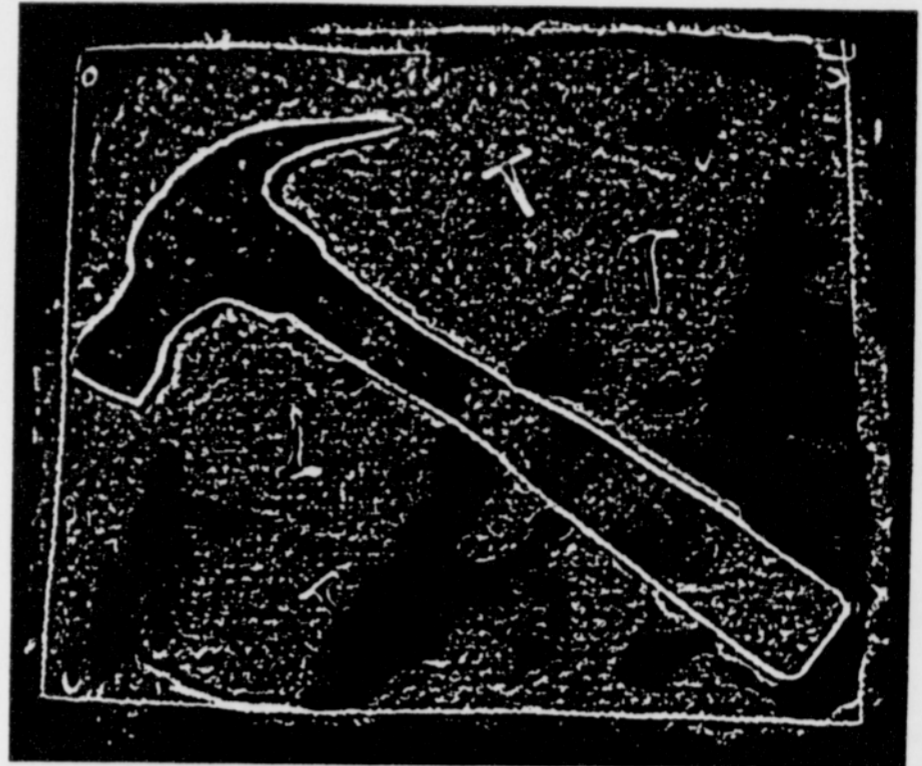


VOCATION

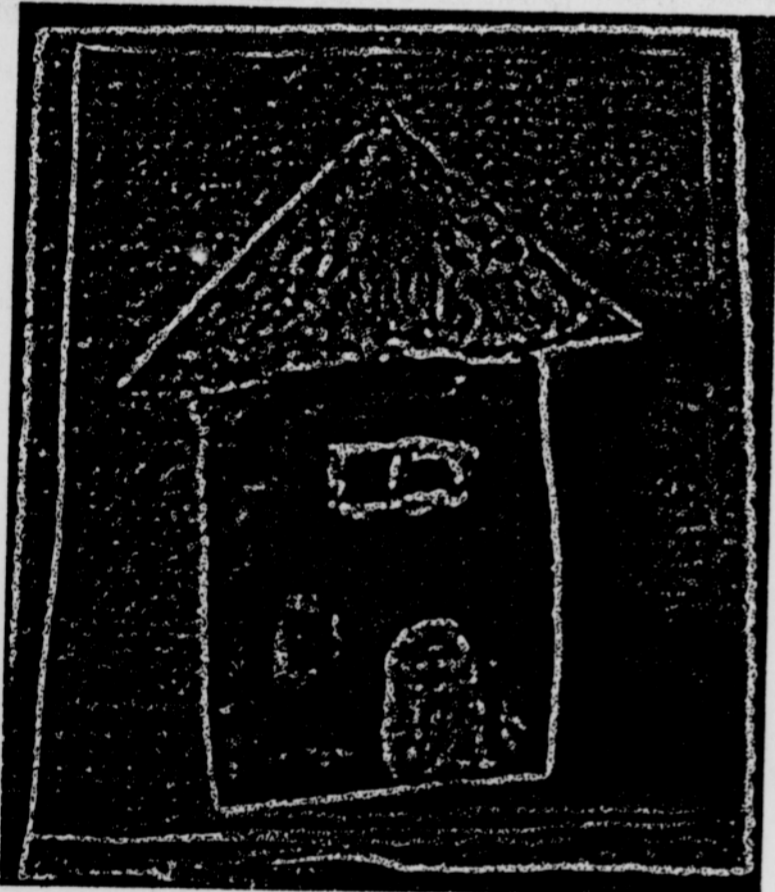
