Gales Creek girl rescues cousin from river

Alameda Mattingly, 15, of Gales Creek, is a very brave girl. She saved her cousin's life.

It happened Sunday when her cousin, Ronnie Long, 13, also from Gales Creek, was learning how to ride a motor scooter. While trying to turn around on Timmerman Road he accidentally kicked the throttle wide open. He ran off the road and fell 15 feet down a bank and into the river.

Ronnie was unconscious under eight feet of water. He had the motor scooter and a heavy rock on top of him. Dean Long, his brother, who saw him fall, yelled out, "It's Ronnie, go get him!"

Alameda ran down the bank. She dived into the water. For two minutes she tried to get the heavy scooter and rock off of her cousin.

Finally she got him

out of the water. But he was still unconscious.

Alameda remembered what she had learned about artificial respiration. She worked on Ronnie until he started to breathe again. Then she ran and got help. In a few minutes an ambulance came and took Ronnie to the Tualitan Community Hospital.

At first the doctors thought he had a skull fracture. Later they found out it was only minor injuries.

"That news was the best Father's Day present I ever got," his father Mr. Fred Long said.

By Monday afternoon Ronnie was back home in good shape. The first thing he did was to go to Alameda's house and thank her for saving his life.
