Hot Chili Sauce

Braise on a dry griddle 5 hot chili peppers and two tomatoes until their skins are almost black. Then put them in cold water and peel off the skins. Mash together the chilis and the tomatoes. They are well mixed. Add one clove of minced garlic, three chopped green onions, a pinch of oregano, salt and pepper to taste. Mix into this 1/2 teaspoon of oil. If you want a milder chili, add more tomato to your mix.
