**Frankfurter and Macaroni Casarole**

Cut in one inch slices four medium sized tomatoes and place some of them as the bottom layer in a casarole dish. Sprinkle these tomato slices lightly with flour. Slice six frankfurters in 1/2 inch pieces and use some as the next layer on top of the tomatoes. Sprinkle each layer with a part of one clove of garlic finely chopped and salt to taste. Cook two cups of macaroni and use some as the next layer over the frankfurters. Grate 1/4 lb. of cheddar cheese. Mix the cheese with one large finely chopped onion. Sprinkle half of the cheese mixture over the layer of macaroni. Then add a layer of finely chopped green pepper to add color and taste to the dish. Repeat again the layers of tomatoes, frank-

**Casarola de Salchichas**

Corte en reventas de una pulgada 4 jitomates de medio tomaño. Se pone una parte de ellos como la primera capa en una casarola. Se rocía con harina. Corte 6 salchichas (wieners) en pedazos de media pulgada. Se pone como la siguiente capa encima de los jitomates. Se rocía capa con parte de un diente de ajo bien picada y sal al gusto. Coce dos tazas de macarón y una parte como la siguiente capa. Ralla 1/4 de libro, o una taza de queso (cheddar) mezcla el queso con una cebolla grande bien picada. Rocía la mitad del queso y cebolla encima del

**ACCIDENT FUND DIRECTOR WRITES**

Migrants need to know about the Motor Vehicle Accident Fund in the state of Oregon.

Recently this newspaper printed an article by Al Klinge, assistant supervisor of the VML opportunity center at Woodburn, describing the Fund. Soon afterward, Klinge received a letter from C. P. Holgate, Director of the Fund.

Here are some excerpts from Holgate's letter:

We . . . appreciate your interest in the Motor Vehicle Accident Fund as evidenced by your well written article.

A majority of our difficult cases involve "mobile people" . . . Perhaps the most difficult and tragic case is where the "bread-winner" . . . is barely providing food, clothing and shelter, with a load of unpaid bills, and a motor vehicle accident occurs . . .

The real tragedy is the lack of understanding . . . It happens to people every day . . .

Mr. Goodenough, manager of Eola Village, I have known for some time . . . He has helped us in many cases . . .

You will be interested to know that Mr. Elmer McClure of Milwaukie, Oregon, who is connected with the migratory labor association was instrumental in having the Motor Vehicle Accident Fund law passed in 1941 when a legislator . . .

I would very much appreciate being placed on your mailing list for the Opportunity News . . . In eighteen years of activity in "pioneering" the Fund, I have been in contact with many migrants personally, and managers of migrant facilities.
