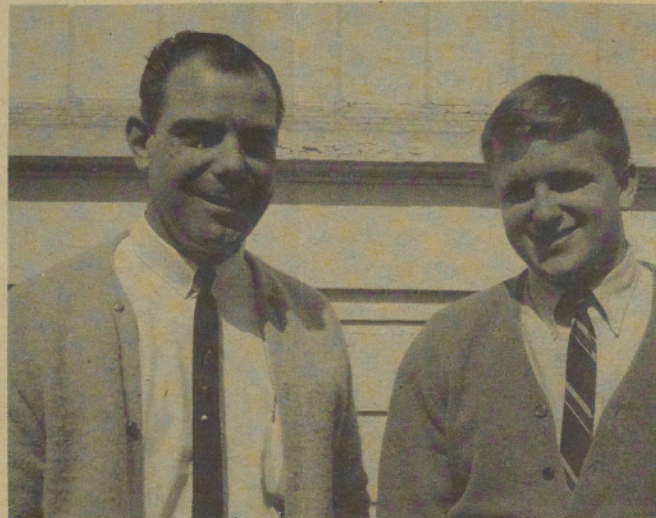


## Here are 3 of the new assistant supervisors of V.M.L. areas
