Herrera is glad to receive your requests, to play your favorite Spanish music and make dedications. He also gives farm labor information in Spanish. KWRC is 940 on your dial.



Jim Amaya gives a weekly program in Spanish on the Dallas station, KROW. He calls the program "Bonito Valle" - "beautiful valley." You can find this program at 1460 on your dial from 7:30 to 8:30 every Friday evening. Amaya plays Spanish music, makes announcements in Spanish, and is glad to play your requests.

If you are a seasonal farm worker, or if you are participating in the OEO program, we hope that you are a regular reader. The paper is for seasonal farm workers, and there is no charge. This is a part of the service of the Valley Migrant League.

Many other persons, friends of the VML program, growers in Oregon, professional persons interested in the economic and social progress of all people, and persons who wish to study English and Spanish, have requested copies of this publication. We are glad you are interested, whatever the reason may be.

Many of these persons have now sent one dollar more for their subscriptions.

Before we accepted subscription money, we checked with the OEO offices in Washington for authorization.

Now we follow this plan, which OEO has approved: If you are not a seasonal farm worker, but wish to receive the newspaper regularly by mail, we invite you to send a contribution of \$1.00 or more for a year's subscription. This will help to offset the cost of printing and handling extra copies. Sixty-five cents of your contribution will be absorbed by postage, at 1 1/4 cents per copy.
