## Jefferson satellite begins day care

Day care and summer school began this week at the Knox Grade School, in the area of Jefferson, a VML satellite. The present attendance is 15 in day care and 10 in summer school. Next week there will be many more, for many families will come to this area during these days to work in the bean harvest. According to Ted Schneider, assistant supervisor at West Stayton, there is room for 45 children in day care and 45 in summer school at Knox Butte.

Phyllis Richotte, VISTA Volunteer, helped with the opening of this program. She reported that the children are from Mexican American families, and four or five of the helpers at the school are Spanish speaking.

As to the newly opened satellite center at Jefferson, Phyllis reported, "It's great."
