AS TIME GOES ON, VIVA WILL GROW UP

Various staff members of the Valley Migrant League have given help to the new organization VIVA, in Washington County. VML helped VIVA get started.

We believe that VIVA will grow up, to take its place in society. Meanwhile, if VIVA gets satisfaction out of belittling the Valley Migrant League, the Migrant Ministry, CAP, and other organizations, we hope that all these agencies will maintain their dignity and pay no attention to the childish jibes.

OUR JOB IS TO FIGHT POVERTY

We must repeat that our first job is to work with farm workers and their families; to show them ways to rise out of poverty; to help them, if they wish help, to lift themselves out of the migrant stream; to lead them to find new security and new self-reliance.

We know that VML shares these purposes with several other organizations.

OUR ENERGIES ARE NOT FOR QUARELING

We do not wish to do anything or say anything which will act as an obstruction to the forward march of any organization which shares these purposes

Nor do we intend to waste time or editorial ink on quarrels between organizations. We hope that all groups which share the purpose of defeating poverty in this nation will understand that we are a cooperative force.

WITH MALICE TOWARDS NONE

Under no conditions do we wish to discourage VIVA or any other organization from pursuing constructive goals. Under no conditions do we wish to feel any jealousy toward any group which strives to combat poverty. We have no intention of entering a battle of insults with persons who are our brothers.
