The Santa Fe Railway asked the Federal Court in Los Angeles a couple of weeks ago for an injunction against its striking shop employees in San Bernardino, the subpoenas issued directing the men to appear in court and "show cause and prove their right to erect a tower overlooking the Santa Fe yards, from which they now view the shops by means of a telescope and photograph the enclosure with cameras."

The tower was erected on private property leased by the strikers. The judge, however, declined to enjoin the men from "rubber-necking" from their tower.—Labor Clarion.

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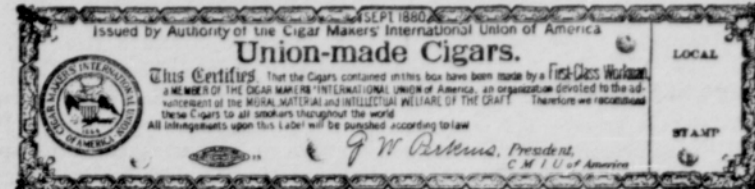
Special Excursion to the World's Fair.

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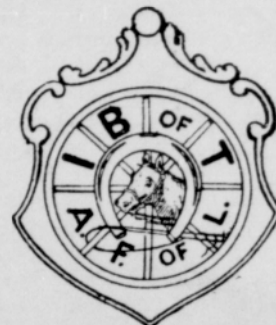
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
