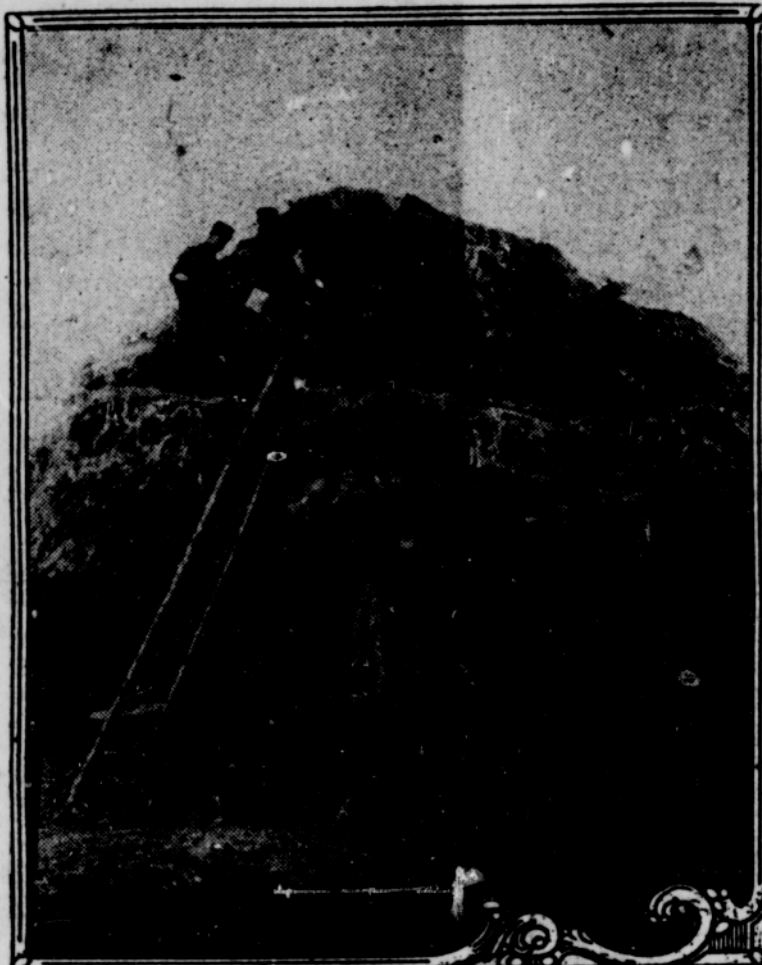


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FRENCH WAR OFFICE IS A HAY RACK.

Lady Hope Nelson, called by English society the most beautiful American ever presented at court, quit her husband's castle in Leicestershire to nurse English and French soldiers in France.

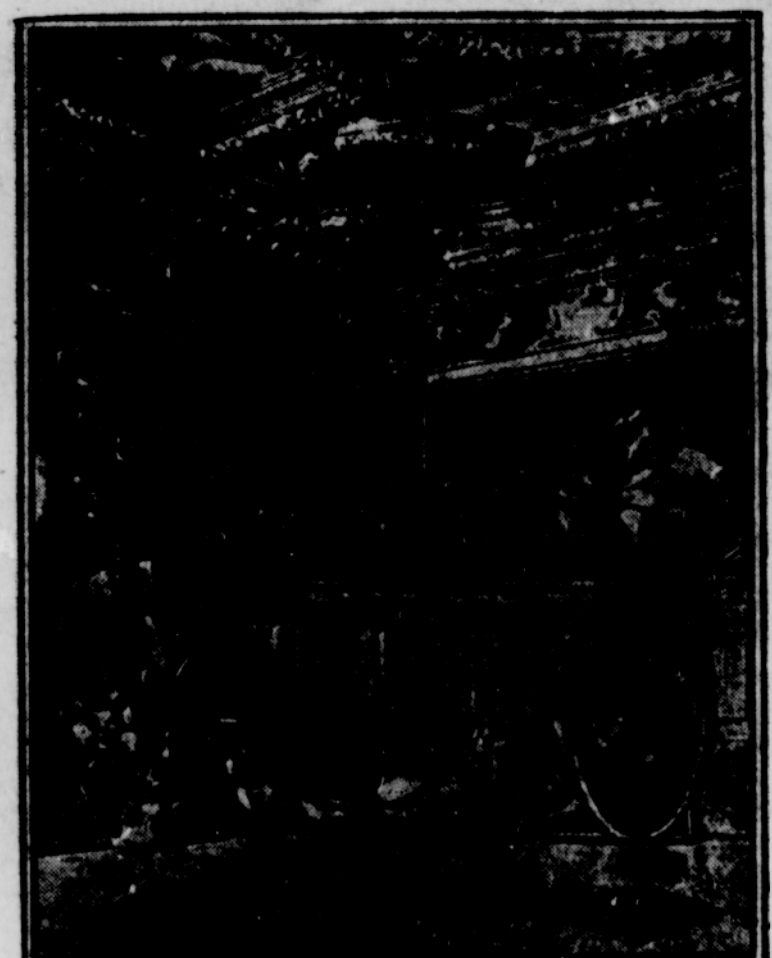


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VENICE STORING PRICELESS OBJECTS OF ART.
