How the Council Works

City Council meetings are held the **second Thursday of each month** and are open to the public. Special sessions are held when necessary and may or may not be open to the public, it depends on the reason for the meeting. Executive sessions are not open to the public, however, no decision pertaining to Town business can be made in executive session; they must come into open session to make a decision. Employee policy and/or employee relation meetings are not open to the public unless the employee wishes to have it so. Budgetary work-sessions are open to the public.

All meetings of residential importance are held at the Community Hall and your in-put is needed before council decisions are made. **SO, IF YOU SEE A NOTICE OF PUBLIC MEETING BEING HELD, PLEASE ATTEND.** Your council does its best to work for you.
