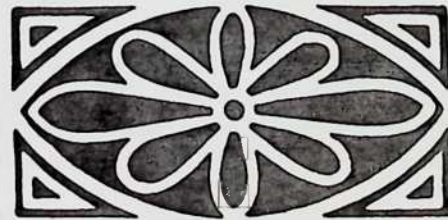
BUTTE FALLS SCHOLARSHIP FUND

On December 15th, over 20 members of the Cobleigh Road Community met at the BLM office in Medford to discuss their concerns about timber cutting and Federal land management practices under the proposed Resource Management Plan (RMP). A lively discourse was had about how Visual Resource Management (VRM) guidelines were used and how they may apply to the scenic corridor along Cobleigh Road.
