### CITY HALL AND COUNCIL NEWS

#### Council Comments:

City Council meetings are held the **second Thursday of each month** and are open to the public. Special sessions are held when necessary and may or may not be open to the public, it depends on the reason for the meeting. Executive sessions are not open to the public, however, no decision pertaining to Town business can be made in executive session; they must come into open session to make a decision. Employee policy and/or employee relation meetings are not open to the public unless the employee wishes to have it so. Budgetary work-sessions are open to the public.

\* Council approved the amendment to Ordinance #80. This ordinance amendment will require council approval prior to placement of anything on the poles or public buildings.

\* Supplemental budget was set-up by Anne Tucker, B.F. Treasurer, with City Auditor approval. It has been published as required.

\* Council approved Planning Commission recommendation that the Forest Meadows subdivision plans be denied at this time.

\* EDC; Joyce Hailicka presented the landscaping grant for the Library/Museum grounds for council approval and Mayoral signature. Also, with council approval, Joyce will be assisting Alan Buchta with a DEQ recycling grant. The Cycle Oregon grant was received, and the pre-approved bike racks and welcome signs for each end of Town will be purchased. \$250.00 of the grant will be used for landscaping around town. The remainder of that grant will be held for the Annual Forest Jubilee in October. Next Council meeting is **February 9th**.

### Planning Commission

Meetings are held at **7:00 pm on Tuesday night**, the same week as Council. In other words, two days prior to Council. These meetings are open to the public. The members work very hard to ensure compliance with the Butte Falls Comprehensive Plan and zoning ordinances, and City, County, and State laws.

On January 10, 1995 the Planning Commission held a Public Hearing at its regular meeting on the tentative plan for the Forest Meadows Subdivision. After a careful consideration of reports and public input, the Planning Commission voted to recommend to City Council the denial of the application submitted by John Boyer.

The date of the next meeting is **February 7, 1995 at 7:00 pm at City Hall**. *Public attendance and input is always welcome!*
