Marshal Bill Johnson reminds us that there is an ordinance in Butte Falls that prohibits dogs from running at large. The City Council has instructed him to enforce this ordinance. When he takes an animal into protective custody, he must make sure that the animal is not abused. Holding the animal in the open dog pen during severe weather conditions is a form of abuse. He will have to send the animal to the Jackson County Animal Control Shelter instead of leaving it in the pen for any extended periods of time. So, please everyone, keep an eye on your dogs and make sure they do not run around town without a leash. This will also save you from having to pay a fine for violating the ordinance.
