

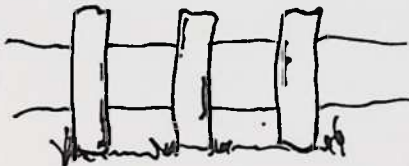


Horse Packing & Wilderness Skills Clinic

Horse Camping Outside The Wilderness was the theme of the 8th annual Horse Packing and Wilderness Clinic held over in Klamath Falls, May 20-21.

The purpose of the clinic was to provide updated information and hands on demonstrations. The clinic provided information on horse, mule, llama, and goat packing; minimum impact stock handling techniques; camping and wilderness management information.

Butte Falls Ranger District employees Jake Crabtree, Rick Taylor and Mary Ann Ceglia representing the Rogue River National Forest set up a display showing people the difference between a good camp and a bad camp. The bad camp showed a camp depicting a horse tied to a live tree, tent set up on vegetation and trees and a fire pit with garbage. The good camp depicted horses set up on a highline tethered over bare ground, the tent in a clear area with no ditching and a light weight stove for cooking. People also had a chance to get some hands on experience in setting up a highline for horses.
