GOVERNMENT IN ACTION

Butte Falls Student Body Vice President Brody Ferguson is experiencing government in action. Brody has been working with the Butte Falls Town Council in an effort to gain approval to have a *Readerboard* constructed in the park.

Brody, a junior has been working on the student government project since his sophomore year. He said the sign has been designed and will cost approximately \$3600. Funding and material will be provided by Ron Lyon, B.J. Rogers, Medite Corp., and Pepsi Cola Co.

Prior to the council meeting of January 25, students were asked to distribute a survey to the residents of Butte Falls. The sign was pictured on the survey form and information was given on the school's choice for a location. Residents were asked to agree or disagree on the proposed location. The returned surveys were presented to the council at the January meeting. Following a discussion of the sign, it's proposed location and the cost of electricity, the council requested further time to study the surveys and make contact with additional residents before making a decision. The council will discuss the *readerboard* at it's next meeting, February 8. If you are a *resident of the Town*

Brody and other student council members are hoping to gain approval for the readerboard at the next council meeting so that construction may begin.
