Well, it's burning season and some of you might not realize that you need a burn permit to be able to legally burn inside city limits. You can purchase a permit for only \$2.50. The permit is good all year. It allows you to burn in a metal barrel that is in good condition and has a metal screen. The items you can burn are; paper, leaves, cardboard, wood, limbs, and burnable trash. You may not burn any plastic, rubber tires, furniture, carpeting, garbage, or any other materials that should be taken to the local landfill. If you have any questions, feel free to contact any of your local firefighters or call City Hall (where you can purchase your burn permit).

We also would like to remind those of you who live outside the city limits that you need to purchase our local fire protection to insure that your home will be safe in case of a fire. This protection is for your benefit and it covers you for one year. You may purchase your fire protection at City Hall for only \$50.00...can be prorated if necessary.
