This is the time of year that many of our senior class are waiting for news on scholarships and college acceptance. Here's what we know on a couple of this year's graduates.

Sam Ackley has received word of his acceptance to Notre Dame. Eighteen students from the state of Oregon applied to this prestigious school, and only five were accepted. Sam and a student from St. Mary's were the only two from So. Oregon. It has been Sam's dream for many years to attend Notre Dame. Sam has been designated as a Notre Dame Scholar which makes him eligible for more scholarships. Sam's SAT scores, high grades, and the results of three essays helped to earn him this title. Sam has also received an offer from Lewis and Clark college for a \$4000 annual renewable scholarship.

Grant Norling has received word of his acceptance and a full paid scholarship to Southern Oregon State College School of Business.
