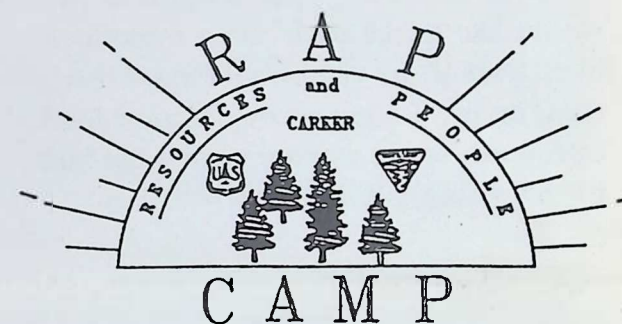

Space is still available for this years RAP (Resource And People) CAMP, scheduled for July 7-14 at Camp Cottonwood near Lakeview and on the Oregon Institute of Technology campus in Klamath Falls. The week-long session will include high school students and classroom teachers from Oregon, Washington and California. Students will spend the week learning about natural resources and their management plus career possibilities. Topics covered during the week include watershed, fisheries, range management, riparian, cultural resources, timber, silviculture, wildlife, botany, minerals, and fire.
