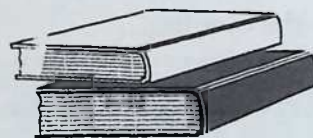
Angel was asked if there was anything special that she would like for folks to know about her. She said, "I hope they would notice on their own that I'm a Christian Person and live my life for God".
