**BURNING IS NOW ALLOWED,
HOWEVER BURNING PERMITS
ARE REQUIRED.**

Now that fall is here along with all those leaves and winter seems to be just around the corner it's probably time to remind everyone about the town ordinance regarding burning regulations. Ordinance 16 reads, "No person inside the boundaries of the Butte Falls City limits shall cause or permit initiation or maintenance on their own property, the property of another, or any property under the direct control of the Town of Butte Falls, any open burning of commercial waste, demolition material, industrial waste, domestic waste, any natural combustible substance or material, or open field burning, without first securing a permit from the Butte Falls Fire Department or City Hall."

"Open burning, when allowed, shall be done during daylight hours only, except by special permission of the Fire Chief or his designated assistant."

Be sure to obtain your permit, only \$2.50 a year. A copy of the ordinance and tips for home incinerator safety can be picked up at City Hall or from the Fire Dept.

**Making a Difference
in Southern Oregon**

For more than twenty years, The Job Council has provided training and employment assistance and has made a positive difference in the lives of workers and employers in Southern Oregon.

The Job Council is funded by a wide variety of local, state and federal sources, including the Job Training Partnership Act (JTPA) and Job Opportunities and Basic Skills (JOBS - a Welfare Reform Program). The funds assist low income youth and adults, welfare recipients and laid-off workers in finding education, training and employment and will lead to long term self-sufficiency. In addition, The Job Council provides child care referral services to all residents in Jackson and Josephine Counties.

Last year The Job Council assisted 5,799 people in the various programs it operates. Of those age 22 and over in job training programs - almost seven out of ten participants entered employment at program completion.

Since August of 1995, The Job Council has provided outreach services to the communities of Butte Falls, Shady Cove and White City. You will find employment counselor Randy Costello available to discuss training and employment options every Tuesday from 1 to 3 p.m. at the Butte Falls Library. Several Butte Falls residents have already accessed training and employment after taking advantage of this localized service.
