This non-profit teenage job training program offers the opportunity for over 400 16-19 year olds to work, learn and camp out for five weeks in locations throughout the Pacific Northwest. NYC is open to youth from all backgrounds and is focused on teaching participants how to meet challenges and work as a team member. Last year NYC crews worked on 15 National Forests, completing 60 different projects that included: trail construction, habitat restoration projects, timber stand improvement, fence building and bridge construction.
