PUBLIC WORKS CHIT-CHAT !!!

With each passing month, more and more interesting and exciting things are happening in the Butte Falls Public Works Department. There is an opportunity this summer for employment in the Public Works Department for four people through the Job Council. If you are interested, applications may be picked up at the Butte Falls High School or at City Hall. Complete the application and return it. If you are not sure if you qualify, complete it anyway. You have nothing to lose but the opportunity for work. The positions will be part-time and pays \$5.50/hr. Job descriptions will include painting, yard and garden maintenance, fence repairs, brush trimming, and park maintenance. Other possibilities may come available. This may be an opportunity to be a part of a very rewarding career to learn some skills that could help in your future career choice.

Construction will be underway soon in the park for the addition of a "Toddlers Playground." This addition will be a great benefit to all the toddlers as a safe place to play and a relaxing place for their parents to watch the little ones. During construction, we ask everybody to stay clear of the construction area, as construction areas can be dangerous. We will try to complete the playground as soon as possible, so the toddlers may have a playground this summer. We will be looking for volunteers to help with the actual construction of the playground equipment and fences as time grows

near to the construction. If we all work together we can make this a great asset to our park for many generations to come.

Water will be drained from the #1 reservoir and will be out of service for approximately two weeks in order to do some much needed repairs on the reservoir to stop approximately 100 gal/per/min from leaking. It should not interfere with any water needs by doing this now. The springs are producing plenty of water and there is still 257,000 gal. of storage capacity in the two remaining reservoirs. As a precaution, please do not waste any water during the repair work.

Spring and summer means the range cattle are once again roaming the areas around Butte Falls. Public Works employees have been mending fences that are needed to keep the cattle out of town. The fences, both in town, and in the area of the Falls, have been cut and taken down, gates opened, and posts and gates knocked down. If anybody knows of fences in need of repairs, please phone Public Works at 865-3220 and let us know where they are located. If anybody has information leading to the conviction of the person or persons responsible for the vandalism of the cities' fences or gates, please call the Marshals' office at 865-3200 and leave a message, or call Public Works at 865-3220, or City Hall at 865-3262. You need not leave your name. All information will be appreciated. Remember, it is your tax dollar that repairs vandals "work".
