Previously unheard of, Crystal Lunsford makes her debut as the new Recycling Club President. She will finish the 1996-97 school year leading this group of approximately ten students.

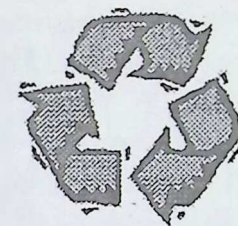
