Smith's ingenuity, the museum is offering a class for young inventors. The class will be offered on Friday, October 10 from 1pm to 3pm.

Some of the items you will learn how to make are: a survival compass, a handmade magnet, a battery made from a potato and a lemon and a hobo cook stove. The class is open to boys and girls ages 10 to 16 years old.

The instructor for the class is Mr. Dan Ceglia. Dan worked for the wildlife department for the US Forest Service. However, his interest in inventions and survival tools began at an early age as a Boy Scout.

"Being a problem solver opens the mind to be more creative," according to Mr. Ceglia. If you have a scientific mind or are just curious, we would like to have you join us for an enjoyable and interesting afternoon at the Bill Edmondson Memorial Museum in the Ernest W. Smith House.
