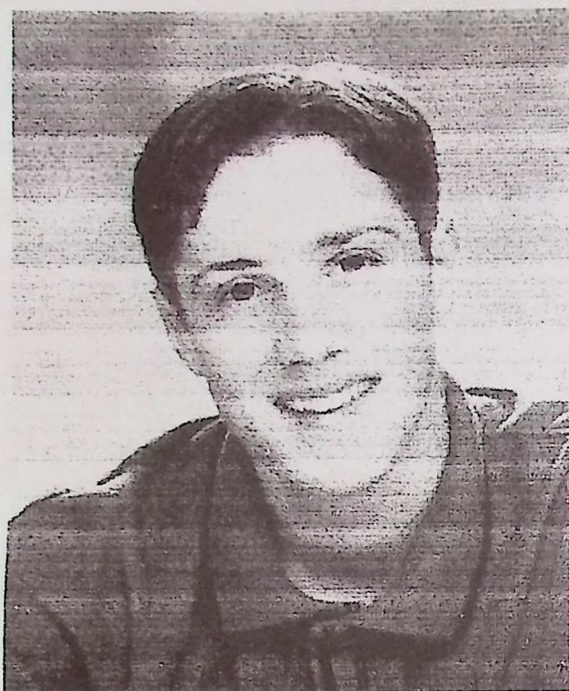


A FIELD OF DREAMS



Danny Krenwinkel, a senior at Butte Falls High School, is one of three local students who have applied for the Jim Matthew Memorial Scholarship. Danny has selected the reconstruction of Mac Field, the local ball field, as his project. "If you have ever visited Mac Field you would realize the field leaves something to be desired," states Danny who played Little League baseball on the field from the third to the seventh grade. "Every year, while taking short-hops off the chin, I hoped for a better field, but I never got one. Now I have a chance to fix up the field for the kids involved in Little League this year, and far into the future."

Danny's plan for the field includes hauling in dirt and installing a sprinkling system for the outfield. Danny estimates the costs for the project to be approximately \$5000.

While talking of his project, Danny refers to the nearly 100 youth from Butte Falls who, each spring and summer, grab their mitts and head to Mac Field to participate in one of the many divisions from tee-ball to majors. "It would be of great importance to complete this project and give the youth of Butte Falls a field of which they can be proud. This pride could lead to more competitive Little League and High school teams. It would also help to encourage some kids, that may be getting in trouble, to do something more positive, like playing baseball."

To date Danny, with the help of sixteen kids and four adults, has put up approximately three hundred feet of fence, re-roofed the dugouts and reconstructed their frames, moved bleachers to the field from the high school, and weeded the entire outfield with weed-eaters. When asked what else he plans to accomplish, Danny explained that he intends to level the outfield, acquire and lay topsoil, and install a sprinkling system.

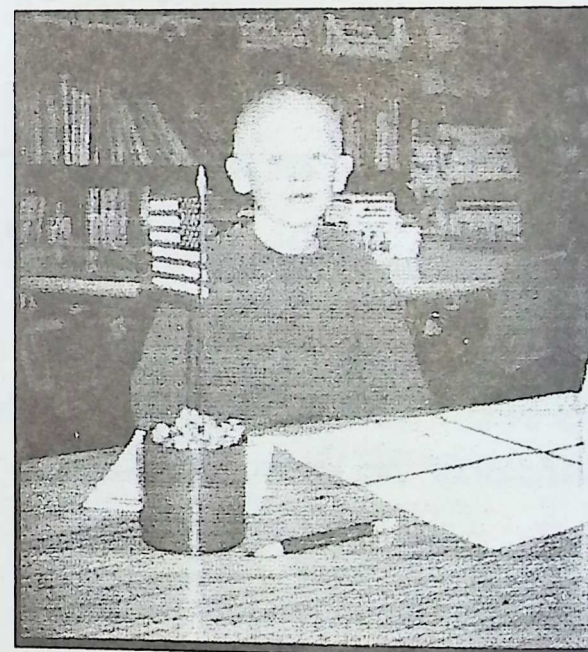
When Danny completes his project he will have the field of his dreams and the kids of Butte Falls will have a field to be proud of.
