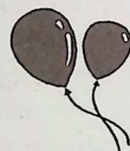

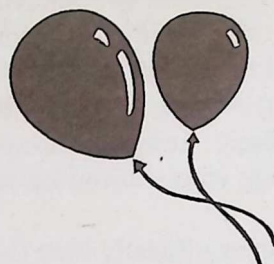

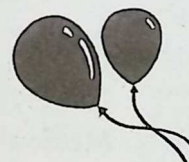

TECHNOLOGY ON HOLD

As the busy world of technology spins
around us, it appears that Butte Falls will need
to wait a little longer to join in. Many of the
opportunities that school is trying to take
advantage of are forcing us to "hurry up and
wait."

The recent application for the 21st
Century Community Learning Center Grant
was not funded. This means that the
Community Technology Resource Center,
complete with computers and training, will be
on the back burner until other funding is
secured.

Although the school has budgeted to
bring in the Internet wiring, hardware and
software, that money will not be available
until Spring of 1999.

The Federal E-Rate program (a school
discount program for electronic access) has
been rescheduled and recalculated. No word
on when those discounts will be announce and
available. At the present, our school district
qualifies for a 77% discount on
telecommunication services, Internet access,
and internal connections.

On the other hand, we are not giving
up. The Virtual Schoolhouse Grant
application was filed in March and will be
awarded this June. If awarded to us, this grant
would provide hardware and software for
school-wide connection to the Internet. Staff
would receive training on methods to
incorporate the Internet into their curriculum.
Another grant opportunity to be filed by July
15, is the US West Technology Academy.
This program would send a four-person team
to Denver next spring. The team, comprised
of two high school students and two adults,
would come back with a server, four Pentium
computers, and lots of expertise to share with
the school and community.

Mr. Boyle has agreed that the
community should already be having access to
the school computers and training. The
Community Technology Resource Center
committee will meet soon to devise a plan for
offering classes this summer.
