

A PARTIAL LIST OF HIGH SCHOOL SUCCESSSES

Below is listed a few of the successes made by high school students this last school year. By no means is it exhaustive. The community can be justifiably proud of their students.

1. Initial requirement that all high school students engage in one hour per week of community service
2. Initial rewarding of an academic letter.
3. Sent 19 FBLA students to the state competition and took second place in the Chapter of the Year category.
4. Sixth successive Honor Council for student government.
5. Six students to the Best of the Best Art show (a larger percentage than other area schools).
6. Students joined the district Safety Committee in making inspections.
7. Initiated a Class of the Year Award based on good works, individual and group responsibility, and other factors.
8. Produced a musical, *The Wizard of OZ*. 50 students tried out, 25 were cast.
9. 138 students participated in athletics.
10. 11 participated in Brain Bowl. The team missed the finals by a small margin.
11. The student government sponsored a successful joint dance with Prospect High School.
12. Five students interned at the Cole Rivers Fish Hatchery.
13. Five students worked with the Education Service District and the Fish Hatchery in learning video work for electronic field trips.
14. 70 of 73 students participated in portfolio presentations.

15. 40 of 73 students had green & white cards, an honor requiring good grades and good citizenship.

16. The students continued their Adopt-a-Family canned food drives at Thanksgiving, Christmas and Easter.

17. Lilian Lawrence, Student Body President, raised funds and awareness in a Breast Cancer Awards drive in cooperation with a blue jean company.

18. Ten students were interviewed for summer jobs with Job Council.

19. The students recognized nine community adults as Citizens of the Month for their contributions to the school and community.

20. Thirteen students went to Washington D.C. in the Close-Up program

21. The school produced an updated curriculum handbook with CIM requirements and CAM preliminary requirements.

22. 37.5% of the 10th grade passed the Oregon Assessment Math Problem-Solving; approximately scoring the same as the rest of Oregon.

23. 100% of the 10th grade passed the Oregon Assessment Writing, far exceeding the average Oregon percentage.

24. 69 students were processed for disciplinary referrals. Two students accounted for 20 of the referrals. Four students accounted for 32 of the 69 or 46% of the total.

25. Students announced at football and basketball games.

26. Peer helpers completed the 8th grade orientation with sponsors for each student. (A pairing of a high school student with an eighth grader.)

27. No student-athletes tested positive for drugs.

28. Ten students of the month recognized.

29. The library computerization is approaching completion.

30. \$42,400 was awarded in scholarships, for a graduation class of 18 students.
