LIONS CLUB

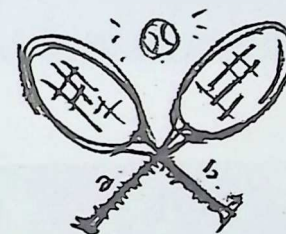
