



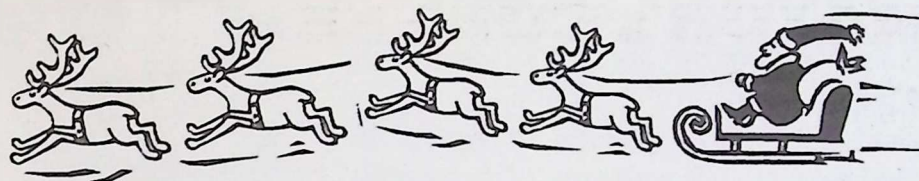
KIDS - CRAFTS AND FUN
