Trail-Park passes purchased in 1999 will remain good in the year 2000 until the new ones come out. We are partnering with the National Park system to come up with a user-friendly pass to be used on both National Park and National Forest lands. That is due out in June; so don't discard your 99 seasonal Trail-Park pass. Any day-passes not used last year are still good, of course, since they do not have the year on them.
