Operation of Class 1 all-terrain vehicles without driving privileges. A person is in violation if the driver does not meet one of the following qualifications. The person must hold a valid driver's license. The person must hold a Class 1 all-terrain vehicle operator permit issued under ORS 390.570; or the person must be accompanied by a person who is at least 18 years of age, who has either a valid drivers license or a valid Class 1 all-terrain vehicle operator permit, and who is either on the same vehicle, if the vehicle is designed to carry passengers, or on a separate class 1 all-terrain vehicle.
