As most of you have heard we lost a long time resident of the Butte Falls Community on May 8<sup>th</sup>, 2001. The death of Blanche Campbell has been determined as a homicide. Anyone with information please contact the Oregon State Police or the Butte Falls Police Department. Any little bit of information may be the key to solving this senseless killing.

I have been receiving complaints about vehicles driving at high rates of speed down the Alley's of town. The speed limit for an alley is 15 mph. When you exit an alley you must stop prior to entering the roadway. This is the same as running a stop sign and the citation amount is the same.
